Health & Safety at Work etc. Act 1974



- Primary health and safety law in GB & UKCS
- Applied offshore by AOGBO
- Inspectors appointed and given powers
- Health & Safety regulations made under the act
- Goal setting in nature
- Reduce risks "So far as is reasonably practicable" – SFAIRP
- Risks must be "As low as is reasonably practicable" – ALARP

SFAIRP & ALARP



- Two terms are essentially the same
- Both require weighing risk reduction against;
 Trouble, time and money to reduce it
- HSWA and regulations require risks at ALARP
- Risks are ALARP if;
 - Trouble, time and money required to reduce risk further is grossly disproportionate to reduction in risk that can be achieved
